~ Background ~

In 1968, Michel and Marie-Claude Galineau settled with great ambition on the property and committed themselves to the quality of their wine. Passing from father to son, in 1989, Dominique Galineau has taken over the property, bringing new skills while respecting the tradition and the know-how of his father. Recently joined by his two sisters, Veronique and Marie-Cecile, this estate has expanded to 50 hectares.

Saint-Sauveur-de-Puynormand is situated in the Gironde department and Aquitaine region (now part of the Nouvelle-Aquitaine region), in the south-west of France at 47 kilometres from Bordeaux, the department capital

~ Tasting Notes ~

Intense color, rich bouquet, combination of fine tannic and a persistent roundness, strawberry and wood overripe. A rich and smooth wine, very elegant. Dark-hued with crimson highlights. Oak overtones on the nose showing graphite and roasted coffee aromas. Robust and fairly dense on the palate with fruit taking a back seat to oak. Unusual style and an acquired taste.
